1st LRC Expedition Roadshow continuation ...


Throughout the event, attendees were encouraged to explore and participate in activities assigned with different roadmap challenges.

The activities included the following activities for LRC stakeholders:

- 1. **Bookmark Making** Participants create and design their bookmarks, which will be laminated and kept as a personalized souvenir.
- 2. **Arrange me if you can** Participants will arrange the books according to their call number within a set time limit. The goal is to arrange it correctly as quickly as possible.
- 3. **Dedication wall** Participants will write short, personal messages of appreciation, encouragement, or thanks to the library staff or the entire LRC (Learning Resource Center) on a dedicated board.
- 4. Book showcase Attendees answered book-related questions, fostering a spirit of collaboration and learning.
- 5. **EBSCO AND SCIENCE DIRECT Databases** attendees were asked to do their research using these two databases.
- 6. **Photo Booth** Participants will have the opportunity to take photos at a themed photo booth or photo wall before exiting, capturing memories of their experience at the LRC Expedition Roadshow.

MAKE YOUR LIBRARY ALIVE (MYLA): BASIC TRAINING FOR LIBRARY-IN-CHARGE

DOST Science and Technology Information Institute November 5-6, 2024

As part of the celebration of the 34th Library Information and Services (LIS) month. Department of Science and Technology-Science and Technology Information Institute (DOST-STII) conducted a two-day training and the very first "Make Your Library Alive" (MYLA) under the Science Communication Advocacy and Library Education Upskilling Program (SCALEUP): basic training for Library-in-charge is served to 28 librarians and non-librarians on November 5 and 6, 2024, at the DOST-STII training room, Taguig City.

It aims to bring out the resources one can require to keep abreast of the latest trends and information within the field of library science. To maintain excellent service delivery, library and information professionals should continue to develop their knowledge and skills in this ever-changing and complex information environment. Professional development is universally recognized as an imperative for ongoing effectiveness.

Continuing with education and professional development defined continuing education as a "broad concept which includes all of the learning opportunities all people want or need outside of basic literacy education and primary education

Some of the topics that were discussed during the training are as follows:

- Managing resources (books, journals, periodicals, multimedia, etc.)
- Cataloging (simple information regarding cataloging)
- Acquiring materials (acquisition of books)
- Assisting (handling requests by patrons)
- Recommending policy (implementing library policy)

Training also incorporates a story through Personal experience (bringing in real-life examples from the library-in-charge), imagination, and creativity (by creating simple/information from the Library by the use of CANVA), etc.

MAKE YOUR LIBRARY ALIVE (MYLA) Training is a learning management system designed for today's digital habits, delivering more engaging and effective micro-learning directly to participants anytime and anywhere.



Ms. Anabel C. Jornacion, MLIS, RL promoted as **Assistant Chief Librarian**


